The Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit The graces which the Bishop or Priest asks the Holy

Spirit to bestow upon the confirmandi during the Sacrament of Confirmation.

- 1. *Wisdom:* the ability to see how all things work together as God sees it.
- 2. *Understanding:* having a heart close to God's so we can know right from wrong.
- 3. *Counsel or Right Judgment:* the willingness to turn to God for direction.
- 4. *Courage or Fortitude:* the ability to face things we are afraid of by knowing that God is our strength.
- 5. *Knowledge:* the ability to discover the path in life God wants us to follow.
- 6. *Reverence or Piety:* the strength to live the greatest commandment: "Love the Lord your God with you whole heart, your whole soul, and your whole mind." Showing honor and respect



to God and to sacred things. 7. *Fear of the Lord (or Wonder and Awe in God's Presence):* the recognition that God alone is worthy of our praise and that God is our strongest defense against all evil.
