

Notes from the Pastor

Our St. Patrick Parish Family is known as a welcoming, friendly, warm and loving parish. The central mystery that we celebrate together every weekend is the Eucharist and all of us are members of the one Body of Christ. Every year we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi (the Body of Christ) and this year we celebrate the Feast of Corpus Christi on June 22. The Feast of Corpus Christi is a celebration of the Eucharist. Although the Feast of Corpus Christi was instituted as a Catholic holiday in the 13th Century, the Sacrament of Holy Communion dates back to Holy Thursday, when Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Holy Communion as he shared the Last Supper with the disciples. At the Last Supper, Our Lord told his disciples to "do this in memory of me." In obedience to the Lord, we gather each weekend to share in the redemptive work of Christ and to receive our Lord, Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity in the Eucharist.

The Risen Lord shares his divine life with us in the Eucharist and the Lord's life and presence has the power to change us as we receive Our Lord and yield to his transforming love and power. The source of this transforming and loving power is divine. In the gospel for the Feast of Corpus Christi we will read (John 6:54-58): "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever easts my flesh and drinks my blood remains in me and I in him. Just as the living Father sent me







and I have life because of the Father, so also the one who feeds on me will have life because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven... whoever eats this bread will live forever." What a gift, incredible gift, freely given to us by the risen Lord! This gift is divine in origin as God shares with us the full grace of his divine presence.

The Church draws her life from the Eucharist. The Eucharistic sacrifice is "the source and summit of the Christian life". The most Holy Eucharist contains the church's entire spiritual wealth: Christ himself, our Passover and living bread. Through his own flesh, now made living and life giving by the Holy Spirit, he offers life to us. At the Eucharistic we see and discover the full manifestation of God's boundless love for us. The Eucharist is the gift of the Risen Lord along with the gift of his saving work. We are called to become what we receive, the alive and living Body of Christ, the Church. All of us are called to be missionary disciples.

We live in a very secular culture where there is an incredible denial of transcendence along with a practical atheism. Most see religion as an add-on claiming that they are just fine the way they are. This is deception since we are created to receive divine reality and we receive this divine life in the Eucharist. We need to be counter-culture. I beg you to reclaim Sunday as a day of worship and a day for family, rest and relaxation. Don't let Sunday become like any other day of the week. Worship as a family and spend quality time together. We do not come to Mass as spectators but we are called to full, active, conscious participation. Make church matter!

Invite others to come to our warm and loving parish family. Often a personal invitation is all people need to become a part of our parish family. We are all called to be missionary disciples and the Eucharist is where we pray together, hear god's Word and receive the Lord in the Eucharist. Let us be proud of our faith and live our faith day-by-day as believing and loving disciples. Be Not Afraid! Share our faith and share with others your love of the Lord and love of the Eucharist!

Our family focused approach to the Sacrament Written by Carl Longnecker

In Holy Communion children take their second step, after Baptism, into full initiation into the Church. They receive the bread and wine at Mass and fully participate at the Table of the Lord.

We are blessed this year to have 21 children make their First Communion, one of our largest classes in recent years. They will make their First Communion at selected Masses between May 3 and May 31.

Do you remember when the Sisters taught the Communion classes to public school students on Saturday morning? Do you remember the big Mass, on a special Saturday, when all of the children came together, parents watching from the back of the Church to watch the children make their First Communion?

Families have changed a lot since then. Families are very busy, and parents seek quality time with their children. Parents want to be better teachers to their children about the Faith; yet they doubt their ability to teach. Within the parish we are from many different cultures,



and don't share the same rituals and traditions, this makes it harder to support each other.

Families have changed, and our First Communion program has changed.

Whenever we can, St. Patrick follows a lifelong faith formation model. We try to teach not only the children but all generations. As a result, our First

Communion program is innovative in these ways:

- "Parochial school families" and "public school families" share exactly the same program.
- Classes are for the children and the parent, they are in the classroom as a team, they learn together.
- The formation covers not only Communion facts and prayers but also what the parents should know about Catholic traditions at home and Christian service.
- It sometimes happens that the sponsor of a child will be a grandparent.
- ◆ And most visibly ... First Communion happens at regular weekend Masses. This better shares the Spirit with the entire parish.

You can see it in our First Communion families. This year we have families that have come recently from Poland, Montenegro, Puerto Rico and Colombia. We as a parish should be proud of these First Communion families. As families – parent, child, siblings, grandparents – they have walked this leg of the spiritual journey that brings their child to the Table of the Lord.



If the journey that is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) had its own mission statement, it would be Matthew 28: "Go, therefore," and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age." Why you may ask? As the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops as stated "R.C.I.A. is the most fundamental of Catholic initiatives, a process designed to introduce, educate, and guide people into the Catholic faith ... it is about forming missionary disciples."

R.C.I.A. is about conversion to Jesus Christ; entering into a deeper living relationship with Him. R.C.I.A. is about becoming a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ; going out and preaching the Good News with their lives. R.C.I.A is about forming others to be Jesus Christ; with full knowledge in order to be the Light in a world of darkness.

This year Christ called nine persons to enter into the full sacramental life of our faith community here at St. Patrick. Of these nine persons, for the first time in my memory, six were either teenagers or pre-teens. Why so large a group of young people? The answer is simple: because others were disciples to them first. An aunt brought her nephew; a father brought not only his two daughters, but his wife as well. Parents saw their children being influenced not only by the world, but friends of other faiths. This discipleship was recognized by a senior member of our community who ask me at a fish fry R.C.I.A recently hosted this Lent, if these young people were involved in the R.C.I.A. journey. I said yes. She smiled and said "our church is in good hands."

This faith community is focused on missionary discipleship. Unlike other parishes, our R.C.I.A. is not a fall to spring journey whereby a person must fit into our schedule. When someone inquires (knocks), regardless of the time of year, we follow the example of Jesus Christ and answer the door. A week after Easter a new member of our parish: Stephen Naylor has entered into the R.C.I.A. journey. Please keep Stephen in your prayers.

So my challenge is this: How well are you being a disciple and bringing others to the faith in this ... **your** faith community? How are you giving of your time which is key to a true disciple by building up the Body of Christ in this ... **your** faith community? Are you actively investing and inviting others either to enter or to come home to this... **your** faith community?

There are many opportunities to assist in the R.C.I.A. journey. By being a sponsor. By being a member of the team and equally important, praying for those who are just waiting for the invitation of Christ to "Come and See." Everyone has a role and responsibility to be that missionary disciple. As Father Jim has said:" God is about a mighty work here in South Tampa. This is our mission territory." Understanding Catholic Devotion to Mary, By: Thomas Merton


"This is often forgotten by Catholics themselves, and therefore it is not surprising that those who are not Catholic often have a completely wrong conception of Catholic devotion to the Mother of God. They imagine, and sometimes we can understand their reasons for doing so, that Catholics treat the Blessed Virgin as an almost divine being in her own right, as if she had some glory, some power, some majesty of her own that placed her on a level with Christ Himself. They regard the Assumption of Mary into heaven as a kind of apotheosis placed in the Redemption would seem to be equal to that of her Son. +++ But this is all completely contrary to the true mind of the Catholic Church.+++ It forgets that Mary's chief glory is in her nothingness, in the fact of being the "Handmaid of the Lord," as one who in

becoming the Mother of God acted simply in loving submission to His command, in the pure obedience of faith. She is blessed not because of some mythical pseudo-divine prerogative, but in all her human and womanly limitations as one who has believed. It is the faith and the fidelity of this humble handmaid, "full of grace" that enables her to be the perfect instrument of God, and nothing else but His instrument. The work that was done in her purely the work of God. "He that is mighty hath done great things in me." The glory of Mary is purely and simply the glory of God in her. and she, like anyone else, can say that she has nothing that she has not received from Him through Christ...."


